


MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

FEDERAL MANAGERS' FINANCIAL INTEGRITY ACT (the Integrity Act)

Agencies must:

- **Establish effective management controls**
- **Evaluate management controls periodically**
- **Submit a broad annual assessment**
- **Report, track & correct material weaknesses in management controls**



**The Integrity Act applies to all Federal managers,
not just financial managers!**



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

OMB CIRCULAR A-123

Key points:

- ***Holds Federal managers responsible for:***
 - ***Proper stewardship of Federal resources***
 - ***Effective -- and cost-effective -- management controls***
- ***Provides flexibility for Agency implementation***
- ***Describes:***
 - ***Management controls, their purpose & standards***
 - ***How to assess controls***
 - ***The “statement of assurance”***
 - ***Identification, reporting & correction of material weaknesses***
- ***Encourages use of “senior management councils”***

MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

WHAT IS A MANAGEMENT CONTROL?

Anything intended to ensure that:

- *What should happen does happen*
- *What shouldn't happen doesn't happen*

Management controls include:

- *Organization*
- *Policies*
- *Procedures*
- *Devices*





MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

EXAMPLES OF MANAGEMENT CONTROLS

Management controls include:

- **A lock on a warehouse door**
- **A doctors' prescription**
- **An authorization to make a purchase**
- **A certification that goods / services have been received before payment**
- **A command and control system**



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

WHY HAVE A MANAGEMENT CONTROL PROGRAM?

Effective management controls ensure:

- **Accurate and reliable information**
- **Compliance with laws & policies**
- **Safeguarding of resources**
- **Economical & efficient use of resources**
- **Safety of operations**



Management controls are not an end in themselves. They are a means to an end: **Mission Accomplishment**

MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

THE ARMY MANAGEMENT CONTROL PROGRAM

Major elements of the Army's program:

- **Day-to-day Program Execution**
 - **Key management controls**
 - **Management control plans**
 - **Management control evaluations**
 - **Assessable Unit Managers**
- **The Annual Statement of Assurance**
- **The US Army Audit Agency**




MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

KEY MANAGEMENT CONTROLS

Key management controls are:

- *Selective*
- *Determined by the HQDA functional proponent*
- *Identified in their Army Regulations*
- *Evaluated formally at least once every five years*



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

MANAGEMENT CONTROL PLANS

A management control plan:

- *Is a schedule of evaluations*
- *Is prepared by each command or activity*
- *Shows:*
 - *What will be evaluated*
 - *Who will do the evaluation*
 - *When they will do it*
- *Can be merged w/ other “oversight” plans*





MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

MANAGEMENT CONTROL EVALUATIONS

A management control evaluation must:

- **Test the key controls**
(e.g., sampling, file review, observation, simulation)
- **Document the results**
(e.g., how tested, deficiencies found, actions taken)

Managers decide how to evaluate:

- ***With a management control checklist***
- ***Using some existing review process***




MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

ASSESSABLE UNIT MANAGERS

These individuals are:

- *The heads of organizations*
- *No lower than Colonel or GS-15*
(where grade structure is lower,
can be senior functional manager)
- *Identified by their commands*
- *The approval authority for*
management control evaluations





MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

STATEMENT OF ASSURANCE

The Army statement consists of:

- *Cover memo fro Sec Army w/ statement of assurance*
- *Tab A – how the Army's assessment was conducted*
- *Tab B – the material weaknesses being reported*
- *Tab C – the Auditor General's independent assessment*

The Army statement is supported by:


- *Feeder statements from MACOMs & HQDA staff*
- *Coordination of the draft statement*
- *Final review by the Army's Senior Level Steering Group*
- *Review of the program & statement by Army Audit Agency*
- *Independent assessment from Auditor General*

MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

US ARMY AUDIT AGENCY

The AAA role in the Army process:

- ***Review management controls in audits***
- ***Recommend key controls***
- ***Identify potential Army weaknesses***
- ***Advise Senior Level Steering Group***
- ***Validate closure of Army weaknesses***
- ***Encourage reporting of weaknesses w/ policy***
- ***Conduct annual review of program & statement***
- ***Issue independent Auditor General assessment***




MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

THE KEYS TO SUCCESS

A successful management control program must have:

- *Leadership emphasis*
- *Education and training*
- *Assessment of controls*
- *Reporting of material weaknesses*



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

LEADERSHIP EMPHASIS

Army leadership philosophy:

Make the Army a good place to invest the public's money!

Army leadership involvement:

- **Secretary & Chief of Staff letters**
- **Senior Level Steering Group:**
 - ***In May (mid-year):***
 - ***Review progress in correcting material weaknesses***
 - ***Review potential new material weaknesses***
 - ***In November:***
 - ***Final review of the Army statement***





MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

LEADERSHIP EMPHASIS

Army leaders have consistently stressed the importance of effective management controls:

MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

ASSESSMENT OF CONTROLS

Any Federal agency or commercial firm must:

- ***Understand its areas of greatest risk***
- ***Establish controls to mitigate that risk***
- ***Assess those controls to ensure they're effective***

Army's annual assessment is based on:

- ***Management control evaluations***
- ***Functional program reviews***
- ***Audits & inspections***
- ***Day-to-day actions & events***
- ***General knowledge of operations***



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

REPORTING OF MATERIAL WEAKNESSES

Criteria: a material weakness:

- **Is a management control problem:**
 - **Controls not in place**
 - **Controls not being used**
 - **Controls not adequate**
- **Warrants attention at the next level of command:**
 - **For their action**
 - **For their awareness**



MANAGEMENT CONTROLS IN TODAY'S ARMY

REPORTING OF MATERIAL WEAKNESSES

Why some hesitate to report:

- *Fear of criticism (an “unnatural act”)*
- *Fear of wider awareness / interference / “help”*

Excuses for not reporting:

- *“The problem was reported through other channels!”*
- *“The problem has already been fixed!”*
- *“The problem was human error!”*

Why reporting is important:

- *Sharing information*
- *Maintaining credibility*
- *Elevating problems for help*


BOTTOM LINE:
