What is the ECC Course?

Target Audience:

Administration:

The Executive Comptroller Course (ECC) provides mid-level military and civilians resource / financial managers a broad perspective of the core competencies of Defense Financial Management. The course emphasizes the application of those competencies for resource / financial management decisions making in the U.S. Army.

Class Structure:

- The course is divided into four general learning objectives with learning accomplished by lectures, group projects, guest speakers, and a Capstone Exercise (a budget-phase HQDA-level appropriation decrement exercise).
- Approximately 25-30 students per class.
- Guest speakers address real-time application of skills and challenges facing the Army and DoD.
- Capstone Exercise ties all instruction together and requires the students to apply everything they have learned.
- 120 CPEs are awarded: including two (2) hours of Ethics training.

Civilians (CP 11):

• GS-11-13.

Military (BS/MOS 36):

- Officer (MAJ, LTC),
- NCO (SFC (w/waiver), MSG).

Nomination Process:

Funding:

DA centrally funds tuition, per diem and travel costs for CP I I and BC / MOS 36 Officers and NCOs.

- The ECC is a three-week resident program conducted at the Whitman School of Management, Syracuse University, Syracuse, New York, and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center in the Adirondack Mountains.
- Classes are conducted from 0800 to 1600 daily with a requirement for several hours of homework each day.
- Pre-course and during course evaluations are done.
- Students should arrive Sunday and depart Friday evening (or Saturday morning) of the third week.
- Students are housed at a contract facility and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center.
- Transportation by motor coach is provided.
- Tuition covers all training and training material, housing, transportation and some meals.
